Action Taken Report 2021-22

1. Bachelor of Arts (BA) Students

This report details the actions taken in response to the suggestions provided by BA students in the recent student survey. The survey indicated that a large portion of BA students found the course content to be difficult (20.35%). Additionally, a sizable portion (27.24%) found the content very easy.

Implemented Actions

- **Instructional Variety:** In response to the feedback on course difficulty, faculty will incorporate a variety of teaching methods in their courses. This may include lectures, discussions, group activities, simulations, and presentations. This will cater to different learning styles and improve engagement for all students.
- **Differentiation:** To address the varying levels of preparedness among students, instructors will provide additional support for students who find the material difficult. This may include office hours, supplemental materials, or the formation of study groups. In addition, instructors will offer challenging activities or projects for students who find the content very easy. This may include independent research projects or opportunities to present their learnings to the class.

Outcomes

• We anticipate that incorporating a variety of teaching methods and providing differentiated instruction will improve student learning outcomes and address the needs of all learners in BA programs.

2. Bachelor of Science (BSc) Students

This report outlines the university's response to the suggestions provided by BSc students in the recent survey. A significant portion of BSc students (21.26%) felt that the grading policy was not clear.

Implemented Actions

• Clear and Transparent Grading Policy: The grading policy will be clearly outlined in the syllabus for all BSc courses. This will include a detailed breakdown of how points are allocated for different assignments, exams, and participation. In addition, instructors will provide examples of their grading criteria to ensure students understand their expectations.

Outcomes

• By ensuring that the grading policy is clear and transparent, we aim to improve student understanding of grading practices in BSc programs and reduce confusion or frustration.

3. Master of Arts (MA) Students

This program will provide students with invaluable career guidance, insights into industry trends, and potential networking opportunities.

Outcomes

• These initiatives aim to equip MA graduates with the necessary skills and knowledge to successfully navigate the job market and advance their careers in their chosen fields.

4. Master of Science (MSc) Students

This report details the actions taken in response to the feedback provided by MSc students in the recent survey. A significant portion of MSc students (25.48%) expressed a desire for more opportunities to collaborate with students from other disciplines.

Implemented Actions

- **Interdisciplinary Research Projects:** Faculty members will be encouraged to develop research projects that involve collaboration between MSc students from different disciplines. This will allow students to gain exposure to diverse perspectives, develop strong communication skills, and tackle complex problems from a holistic viewpoint.
- **Cross-Disciplinary Course Offerings:** New elective courses will be offered that encourage MSc students to explore topics outside their primary area of study. These courses may involve guest lectures from faculty in other disciplines or collaborative projects with students from different programs.

Outcomes
